Step 1. Determine type of training (circle/check) and note safety requirements for training, all of these must be present for the duration of any training session; all safety personnel, trainers, etc. certifications must be presented on the day of training prior to starting. It is the unit's responsibility to provide their own safety equipment, however they may utilize facility equipment if available. Step 2. Review facility rules

- USMC training sessions can only occur when a currently certified Marine Combat Instructor of Water Survival (MCIWS or equivalent) is present for the entire training.
- 1 MCIWS per every 10 students.
- Instructors are responsible for the safety of all personnel while in/around the facility.
- Units are required to clean the facility (e.g. clean locker rooms, pool deck, etc.) and replace lane lines 10mins before the pool opens to the public.
- Any MCCS equipment damaged during training will be charged to the tenant unit.
- MCCS staff has the authority to stop unit training when there is a safety violation.
- A violation in rules will result in loss of privilege to use the pool for unit training.

Step 3. Submit a reservation request to the facility Training requests outside of normal unit training hours or that requires pool closure must have written justification attached and signed by the unit S-3 training officer. This request must be turned into the pool a minimum of 10 (ten) business days prior to the date requested. Approval for pool closure will be routed through the MCCS Semper Fit Aquatics Program Manager by the facility manager)
